Summary

Population:

Population has increased 26,280 from 2000 to 2005.

Females outnumber males 51.3% to 48.7%.

The largest age group is 25-44 years.

The white population is the majority with 78.5%.

The Hispanic population in this area has increased 61.5% from 2000-2005.

The population is expected to increase 95,420 from 2010-2030.

Labor Force:

The unemployment rate has fallen recently from 5.9% in 2004 to 5.6% in 2005.

Educational Attainment:

High school graduates top the list with 26.3%, followed by Bachelor's Degree with 26.2%.

Industry Employment:

The top two industries in this area are Trade, Transportation and Utilities, and Professional and Business Services.

Occupational Employment:

Top five occupations currently are: retail salespersons, laborers and material movers, cashiers, customer service representatives, and office clerks.

Projected Occupations:

The top five occupations with the most openings in 2002-2012 are: retail salespersons, registered nurses, cashiers, molders/shapers/casters, and combined food prep and servers.

Occupational Wages:

The average wage for the area is \$16.48, with an entry wage of \$8.01 and an experienced wage of \$20.70.

Per Capita Income:

With a PCI of \$30,814 in 2004, this area is well ahead of the state's PCI of \$27,185.
