
## This Quilt of Valor will be awarded to:

Chaplain (MAJ) Kari Maschhoff has served as the Director of Resource and Information Management for the U.S. Army Chaplain Center and School at Fort Jackson since 2016. She entered the U.S. Army in 2004 and attended Chaplain Basic Officer Training at Fort Jackson, S.C. Her first assignment as a Battalion Chaplain was with Headquarters Company, 3rd Battalion, 4th Aviation Regiment, 4th Infantry Division at Fort Hood, Texas. While with 3-4 AVN BN she deployed in support of Operation IRAQI FREEDOM to Camp Taji, Iraq. Later she was reassigned to the 201st Military Intelligence Battalion at Fort Sam Houston, Texas. While with the 201st MI BN she deployed again in support of Operation IRAQI FREEDOM to Camp Cropper, Iraq. She was than reassigned to the 442nd Signal Battalion, Fort Gordon, Georgia. Following attendance at Chaplain Captain Career Course at Fort Jackson, South Carolina, Chaplain Maschhoff was reassigned to Army Central Command where she deployed to Kuwait in support of Operation NEW DAWN and Operation ENDURING FREEDOM. She was later assigned to Network Enterprise Technology Command (NETCOM), Fort Huachuca, AZ where she served as the Deputy Command Chaplain for NETCOM and as the Chaplain Personnel Manager for Army Cyber Command.

Chaplain Maschhoff holds a B.A. in Economics, and five Masters degrees in addition to an extensive military education.
