For: Children's librarians and coordinators, Childcare teachers and staff, Preschool teachers, School librarians, library outreach staff, educators, organizations such as First Steps and Head Start/ Early Head Start.

The South Carolina State Library welcomes PLA Trainer and Early Literacy specialist Susan Bard to present workshops called EveryDay Literacy using the Every Child Ready to Read Second edition program. These workshops are designed to help those who work with young children and their parents incorporate literacy activities into daily routines, and librarians to be able to apply the practices in a programing setting.

EveryDay Literacy is built on the Public Library Association Every Child Ready to Read program. The second edition of ECRR provides public libraries and other early literacy centers with tools to help prepare parents/caregivers for their critical role as their child's first teacher. Training includes how the five simple practices—talking, singing, reading, writing, and playing—develop language and pre-reading skills in children from birth to age five, building on the six early literacy skills from the previous edition. These trainings continue the family literacy emphasis by the State Library providing each attendee with a literacy bag containing the SCSL family literacy calendar, South Carolina Day by Day, a book, and supplementary materials to use in trainings or programs.
